Ephesians: Love & Submission in the Family

Ephesians 6:1-4

Children (v. 1-3)

- Children, we are called to obey our parents 'in the Lord'
- Children (τέμνα) = offspring of any age

 oSince Paul emphasizes rearing, it is more directed at non-adult children

 oHowever, culturally, fathers had a level of authority over their adult children as well
- Obey = Listen to them, and do what they tell you to o'In the Lord' = <u>Christian</u> parents who are obeying <u>Iesus</u>
- Paul's instruction is based on the 5th commandment (Deut 5:16) • Here, the focus is on giving honor to your parents
 - Honor = giving a good <u>name</u> or <u>reputation</u> to oTo do this, we must make <u>God</u>-honoring choices
- Paul calls us to obey our Christian parents for our own good (v. 3)

Parents (v. 4)

- Parents, we are called to train & instruct our children in God's truth
- Parents: A term of relationship, not of age
- Train = Help them develop godly ways of acting
- Instruct = Help them develop goldy ways of <u>thinking</u> oBoth based in <u>Scripture</u>
- We are not to do this in a way that promotes <u>anger</u> in our children or ourselves oThis was a stark contrast to the family structure of the Greco-Roman culture around the early Church
- This means that we must know our children to understand what they need and how to raise them (Pro 22:6, CSB)
 - This will not look the same for every child

So What?

- Children, are we listening to and obeying the godly instruction of our parents?
- Parents, are we training our children to know and obey Jesus?
- Both are acts of love & submission to Jesus & one another
