Putting Christ First: Fullness in Christ

Colossians 2:9-15

Fullness in Christ (v. 9-10)

- Paul asserts that in Christ *alone* <u>dwells</u> the <u>fullness</u> of God (v. 9; see 1:19) • Not in some <u>temple</u>
 - \circ Nor dispersed amongst various <u>semi-divine</u> beings (v. 10b)
- Thus, when we find our lives in Christ, we are <u>filled</u> too

 Paul is countering a claim of false teachers that we need more than just <u>Jesus</u>
 All that we can <u>know</u> or <u>experience</u> of God is therefore found in our relationship with Jesus
 - We need no other <u>experience</u> from any other source
 - For Jesus, as God, is <u>over</u> them all (v. 10b)

Inclusion in Christ (v. 11-12)

- Paul goes on to describe how we have been made full in Christ
- By <u>circumcision</u>: A symbol of inclusion into <u>God's people</u>
 Not the <u>physical</u> rite
 But a <u>spiritual</u> circumcision of our <u>hearts</u> (Deut. 10:16; 30:6; Jer. 4:4; Rom 2:29)
- By <u>baptism</u>: A symbol of inclusion into <u>Christ's death</u>
 Sharing in His <u>burial</u>
 In order to share in His resurrection

Alive in Christ (v. 13-14)

- Paul describes our need for death & rebirth
- Before Jesus, our <u>sinfulness</u> left us <u>dead</u> & <u>rebellious</u>
 Both its natural result & its underlying root ("uncircumcised flesh")
- But through Christ, God has made us <u>alive</u> • By forgiving our sins
 - By legally fulfilling the <u>punishment</u> that our sins deserved on the <u>Cross</u>

Victory in Christ (v. 15)

- Through His death and resurrection, Jesus not only paid for our sins
- But claimed victory over all <u>rebellious</u> powers
 Both <u>human</u> and <u>spiritual</u>
- Thus, we have nothing to fear from them

• Do we find our lives in Christ? • As Redeemer from sin oAs Conqueror over our rebellious hearts

• Are we living out of that truth?
