What Kind of King?

(John 12:12-19)

Palm Sunday

- A week before Jesus' <u>resurrection</u> • About 5 days before His <u>crucifixion</u>
- One of the few stories of Jesus found in all 4 Gospel accounts
 Osignificant as a declaration of His role as Messiah

The Expectations (v. 12-13)

- John sets the Jesus entrance to Jerusalem against the backdrop of several events oShortly after He has raised <u>Lazarus</u> from the dead (John 11)
 - oThe day after Mary, Lazarus' sister, anointed Jesus (John 12:1-8)
 - OAs pilgrims gathered for the <u>Passover</u>
- Word had spread of Jesus' teachings and miracles
 - OAnd the crowds heard He was about to come into Jerusalem
 - oSo, they gathered to see Him on the outskirts of town
- The crowd took palm branches & their coats (Luke 19:36) and stretched them along the road into the city for Jesus to enter on
 - The palm had become a nationalistic symbol for Israel tied to its <u>liberation</u> by the <u>Messiah</u>
 - o'Thus, the crowd's cries: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"
 - Hosanna: "Save us now!"
- They were declaring that the saw Jesus as the coming <u>Messianic King</u> (see 2 Sam. 7:12-14a) o'The whole scene is one of welcoming a <u>victorious</u> king (see 1 Thess. 4:17)

What Kind of King? (v. 14-16)

- Jesus was aware of the crowd's ideas
 - oSo, He had a donkey's colt brought to ride into the city
 - oThis was to tell the crowd what kind of king He was
 - One bringing <u>salvation</u> through <u>righteousness</u> not <u>war</u> (Zec. 9:9)

The Response (v. 17-19)

- The crowds knew of Jesus' sign of raising Lazarus
 - OBut had not necessarily understood it
 - He was claiming power over <u>death</u>
 - They simply wanted power over Rome
- Jesus was not the King they wanted
 - oSo, when the Pharisees and religious leaders plotted to have Him killed, the crowds quickly turned on Him (John 19:15)
- But Jesus was the King they (and we) need

oNOT one whose power and authority rests in political halls oBut the One who is seated in the heavens

■ Who has power over <u>sin</u> and <u>death</u>
