# **ACTS:** The Story So Far

### The Story of Jesus

- Acts is the continuation of the Gospel of <u>Luke</u> (Acts 1:1-3)
- It is the story of Jesus continuing His ministry through the <u>Holy Spirit</u> working in the early Church (Acts 1:8)
  - oThe Church is commanded to stay in Jerusalem until the coming of the Holy Spirit, which happens at <u>Pentecost</u> (2:1-4)

### Jerusalem

- Through the work of the Spirit and the preaching of the Apostles, the Church grows constantly oWith a commitment to <u>learning</u>, <u>praying</u>, <u>sharing</u> & <u>fellowship</u> (2:42-47)
- <u>Signs</u> & <u>wonders</u> mark the Apostles' ministry, which is often met with <u>hostility</u> by religious leaders (ch. 3 & 4)
  - o And the Lord shows His protection of the Church through the killing of Ananias & Sapphira
- As ministry grew, more <u>leaders</u> are added (ch. 6)
  - One of whom, Stephen, is then martyred for preaching in the name of Jesus (ch. 7)
    - Which causes <u>persecution</u> to break out and scatter believers beyond Jerusalem
    - One of the persecutors of the Church is <u>Saul</u> of Tarsus (Acts 8:1-3)

### Judea & Samaria

- The Gospel begins to spread to surrounding areas through the ministry of the Apostles and other believers
- Philip preaches in <u>Samaria</u> & to an <u>Ethiopian</u> eunuch who returns to his homeland transformed by Jesus (8:4-40)
- <u>Saul</u>, in his zeal to persecute the Church has a vision of Christ on his way to Damascus (9:1-31) oHe puts his faith in Jesus and begins ministering in His name
- Peter begins ministering in <u>Judea</u> mostly to fellow Jews (9:32-43)
  - OUntil the Spirit leads him to a Roman Centurion named Cornelius (ch. 10)
  - OGentiles begin putting their faith in Jesus and receiving the Holy Spirit
    - As Peter & others struggles with their inclusion in God's kingdom (11:1-18)

# To the Ends of the Earth, part 1

- Syrian Antioch becomes a new hub for the Church (ch. 12)
  - oWith exponential growth & missionaries using it as a base of operations
    - Including <u>Barnabus</u> & <u>Saul</u>
- Meanwhile, greater <u>persecution</u> hits the Church in Jerusalem through Herod (ch. 12) o<u>James</u> is martyred; <u>Peter</u> is imprisoned & then saved through divine intervention oGod brings judgment on <u>Herod</u>, resulting in his death
- Barnabus & Saul go on their first missionary journey (Acts 13-14)
  To Cyprus\*; Pisidian Antioch; Iconium; Lystra; & then return to Syrian Antioch
- Because of the influx of so many Gentiles into the Church, Paul & Barnabus are summoned to <u>Ierusalem</u>, to a counsel of the Church leaders (Acts 15:1-34)
  - oThe consensus is that Gentiles who put their trust in Jesus are equally part of the Church
    - And they should NOT be made to follow the Jewish Law or customs

• Paul & Barnabus then part ways over whether to bring Barnabus' cousin John Mark with them (Acts 15:35-41)

## To the Ends of the Earth, part 2

- Timothy joins Paul & Silas and they are called in a vision to bring the Gospel to Macedonia
- Despite persecution and resistance, Paul and co. establish congregations in <u>Philippi</u>, <u>Thessalonica</u>, & <u>Berea</u>
- Paul travels to Athens, where he addresses the philosophers' guild and sees some conversions
- Paul then travels to Corinth, where he partners with Priscilla & Aquilla to establish the Church, and stays for 18 months
- He then returns to <u>Jerusalem</u>, with a layover in <u>Ephesus</u>, vowing to return
- We are introduced to <u>Apollos</u> who travels to Ephesus to help build and strengthen the Church there

#### So What?

- The story of Acts, and the Church throughout history, is the story of the Holy Spirit continuing the work of Jesus through His people
- We can see God's hand at work, and He is inviting us to join Him in it
