Signs of the Messiah: An Introduction

(Various Texts)

Give Me a Sign!

- Have you ever asked God for a sign?
- If so, did He give you one? • What was it and how did it help you?
- Maybe you don't look for signs (1 Cor. 1:22)
- Throughout Scripture, God used signs as a means of communicating truths to people
 - oGideon asked for a sign of God's <u>deliverance</u> through his hand (Jdg. 6:36-40) oHezekiah asked for a sign of God's <u>healing</u> (2 Kgs 20:8-11)
 - oMoses performed signs showing God's <u>power</u> (Ex. 7:3)
 - oThe Prophets acted out signs to illustrate messages of judgment and mercy
 - Isaiah went around in his underwear to convey God's imminent judgment of Israel (Isa. 20)
 - Jeremiah uses various sign acts as teaching tools (Jer. 13:1-11; 16:1-4; 18:2-11; 19; 32:11-15)
 - Ezekiel also was called to enact signs as a way of portending Jerusalem's siege (Ez. 4)
- The overwhelming purpose of signs is to point people to the <u>truth</u> oWhether it be a <u>teaching</u> aide, <u>miraculous</u> occurrence, or <u>foretelling</u> an event
- And the result *should* lead to greater <u>faith</u> in God • Though this is not always the case

Jesus, the Sign-Giver

- In the Gospels, Jesus is often asked to perform signs as <u>proof</u> of His claims

 Though, this often was not due to their desire to <u>trust</u> Jesus, but rather as a means of trying to <u>discredit</u> Him (Matt.16:1-4)
- Jesus performed signs as <u>proof</u> of His claims • Like the Prophets, He used them as <u>teaching</u> tools to point people to the truth • And like Moses, He used them to display the <u>power</u> of God at work in Him
 - To bring about <u>deliverance</u>, <u>healing</u>, and even warn of <u>judgment</u>

John's Purpose

- Jesus' use of signs is displayed the most clearly in the Gospel of John
- This is so central that the Jesus is not described as performing <u>miracles</u> in John • Rather, He gives the people <u>signs</u> (see John 2:11, 18, 23; 3:2; 4:48, 54; 6:2, 14, 26, 30; 7:31; 9:16; 10:41; 11:47; 12:18, 37; 20:30)
- John even states that his purpose in writing his Gospel is present Jesus' <u>Messianic</u> claims (John 20:30-31)

oUsing signs as evidential proof

• John makes it clear that it <u>believe</u>/<u>faith</u> in Jesus as Messiah that gives <u>eternal life</u> oHis Gospel was written to show us that truth in the person and work of Jesus

Our Purpose

- We will spend the next few months looking at the 7 signs that John lays out for the identity of Jesus
 - oWater to Wine
 - oClearing the Temple
 - oHealing the Official's Son
 - oHealing the Lame Man
 - oFeeding the 5,000
 - oHealing the Blind Man
 - ORaising Lazarus
- John tells us these signs help our <u>faith</u> (John 20:31)
 - o"<u>Start</u> believing" or "<u>Continue</u> believing"?
 - Real faith must be <u>enduring</u> faith
- And we will wrestle with Jesus' claim about our use of signs (John 14:12)

- Is it leading us to a deeper, enduring faith in Him?
