The Big Picture: A Kingdom of Priests (Exodus 3, 19 & 20)

A Kingdom of Priests

- Generations have passed since God's promise to Abraham
- Of Abraham's 8 sons, God chose <u>Isaac</u> to be the one whose line would bear the covenantal promise of a <u>redeemer</u> (see Gen. 21:12; 25:1-2)
- God then selects Isaac's son <u>Jacob/Israel</u> to be the heir to the promise (Heb 11:9) oHis 12 sons and their families grow to become the people known as the <u>Israelites</u> who inherit both the covenantal role and promises
- Through a series of events centered on Jacob's son Joseph, the family was brought to <u>Egypt</u> and settles in the eastern region of Goshen (Gen 46:32)
- The Israelites were <u>enslaved</u> by a new Pharoah, and remained that way for 400 years (see Gen 15:13; Act 7:6)
- Then God set a plan in motion to <u>free</u> them from slavery and set them <u>apart</u> (Ex 2:24)

The God who Is (Ex. 3:11-15)

- God calls Moses to bring the Israelites out of Egypt and their slavery
- When asked why he is chosen, God makes it clear it is not about Moses or his abilities, but rather about God being with him
 - oImmanuel/God with us theology
 - Just like Adam, Noah, & Abraham
- God tells Moses His name: $\underline{YHWH} = "\underline{I} \underline{AM}"$
 - OHe is not like the gods of the Egyptians that they have known for generations OHe is the <u>Author</u> of <u>Existence</u>

A Kingdom of Priest (Ex. 19:3-6)

- Once God has delivered the Israelites, He gives them <u>instructions</u> on how to live as His <u>covenantal</u> people: The <u>Law</u>
- The reward for obedience was a special duty, to serve as "priests"
 - oAct as God's <u>representatives</u> on earth because when the Law was obeyed, they would <u>represent</u> the LORD more <u>accurately</u>
 - oMinistry is the responsibility of the entire nation/people

The Law (Ex. 20)

- The Law was given to Israel after God had established a <u>relationship</u> with them (Ex 20:2)
 - oThe Law was meant for God's chosen people, not the world at large
 - oKeeping the Law was an act of obedience due to relationship with God
 - OKeeping the Law was never a prerequisite for being in relationship with God
- The Ten Commandments act as a summary to the entire Law
- Community concern: no need for the written Law until there was a large community in place

So What?

- o Just like then, God rewards our obedience with a special role
- We are:
 - oAll called to ministry

oGod's representatives to the world oTo be in community with God's people
