Ephesians: Unity in Diversity

(Ephesians 4:7-16)

The Giver of Gifts (v. 7-10)

- Through the work of Christ & the Spirit, the Church has <u>unity</u> (v. 3-6)
- Now, Paul focuses on the <u>individuals</u> who make the Body of Christ oThe focus is on diversity of <u>people</u>, <u>talents</u>, and <u>roles</u> in the Church
- Every member of the Church has been given gifts by Christ
- These gifts come as a result of Christ's primary gift of <u>Himself</u> for us oThus, the first gifts are <u>salvation</u> & <u>eternal life</u>
 oAll other gifts flow as a result of these first gifts
- Paul quotes Psalm 68:18 as evidence of this truth, showing that part of the purpose of Jesus' first coming was as <u>Giver</u>

Leadership as a Gift (v. 11-13)

- God's gifts include those who provide leadership to the Church o'Their <u>authority</u> is grounded in and expressed by the true <u>proclamation</u> the <u>word</u> of <u>God</u>
- These are not offices, but rather <u>roles</u>
 oNot a <u>hierarchy</u> of value, but rather a calling to <u>serve</u> the Body (see Mark 10:42-45)
- Apostles:
 - oThose who first <u>proclaimed</u> the Gospel, who had seen the risen Christ, and were entrusted by Jesus to establish the Church (ex. Peter, Paul, and others)
 - oThis might also refer to Missionaries who help establish the Church among new peoples
- Prophets:
 - oThe <u>authors</u> of the Old Testament
 - oThose, who through the Holy Spirit, <u>proclaim</u> a direct word from God, which must be tested against Scripture (1 John 4:1)
- Evangelists:
 - oThe authors of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John)
 - oThose who proclaim the Gospel to bring people into relationship with God through Christ
- Shepherds & Teachers:
 - oThose who proclaim and explain God's word to nurture and equip the Church
 - o<u>Pastors</u>, <u>Elders</u>, <u>Teachers</u>
- All these roles are for one purpose
 - ONot to be the only ones doing ministry
 - OBut rather, to equip the whole church to minister
 - Which produces <u>unity</u>, <u>knowledge</u>, and <u>maturity</u> in Christ in everyone

The Fruit of the Gospel (v. 14-16)

- When we are <u>rooted</u> in God's truth oThe result of Spirit-led <u>proclamation</u> of God's word
- Then we are not easily led <u>astray</u> and can stay <u>focused</u> on God's design for us
- And as we *proclaim* His <u>truth</u> to one another in <u>love</u>, we grow into the <u>body</u> He means us to be
- When we are concerned about what are our specific gifts are, we may miss the point

oIt is not primarily about what your gifts are oIt is about being a gift to others
