Centered in Christ: The Heart of the Gospel

Colossians 1:13-23

The New Exodus (v. 13-14)

- Paul describes the work of God in Christ as <u>deliverance</u> OGod *has* delivered us from the 'domain of darkness'
 - Exousia: <u>Authority</u>, <u>power</u>
 - Like God delivered the Israelites from their bondage in <u>Egypt</u>
- God not only frees us from bondage, but also <u>transfers</u> us to a new type of <u>authority</u> (v. 13b)
 One ruled by His <u>Son</u>; our loving <u>rescue agent</u>
 - Just like Israel was not called to just leave Egypt, but was called to the <u>Promised Land</u> as an <u>inheritance</u> (see v. 12)

The New Creation (1:15–20)

- Paul defines the person and work of Jesus in terms of the Creation
- He is the <u>image</u> of the invisible God • He has made the invisible visible
- He is the <u>firstborn</u>* of all Creation
 - $\circ\ensuremath{\mathsf{It}}$ is an ancient way of saying that Christ is $\underline{\mathsf{preeminent}}$
 - And thus, He is the means by which the Father created all things (v. 16; see also John 1:1-3; Gen. 1:3, 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 24, 26)
- Thus, Jesus is Lord of it all • Especially the <u>Church</u>
 - Dictating and empowering her mission
- And in His resurrection, He has become Lord of even death
- In Christ, we can become part of His new <u>Creation</u>
 Which comes as a result of His <u>reconciling</u> everything to Himself
 Bringing us back to a state of <u>peace</u> with God
- This New Creation is not purely a <u>future</u> event • He offers it to us <u>now</u> (2 Cor. 5:17)

A New Age (v. 21-23)

- Paul describes our state <u>before</u> Jesus

 <u>Alienate</u> from God: Our <u>standing</u>
 With our <u>minds</u> against God: Our <u>thinking</u>
 Practicing <u>evil</u>: Our <u>actions</u>
- Through His sacrifice, Jesus ushered in a new age, marked by reconciliation
- In which we are *declared*:
 <u>Holy</u>, <u>blameless</u>, & above <u>reproach</u>

 $\circ \text{Not}$ by our own merits, but by $\underline{\text{Christ's}}$ work

- This declaration has a <u>future-focused</u> undertone

 It is something started on the <u>Cross</u>
 But we await the full <u>culmination</u> of this new age
 - Which will take place when Christ returns

So What?

- Because Jesus is Lord of all (v. 15-20)
- We can have confidence that God's rescue mission is successful (v. 13-14)
- Ushering us into the Messianic Age (v. 21-23)
- Are we living in this reality?
