Lies We Believe: More than We Can Handle?

Various Texts

The Claim: "God will never give you more than you can handle."

- Often stated when we are going through difficulties
- Underlying premise: You are strong enough to take on anything that comes your way

Scripture's Truth

- We are not supposed to handle anything alone
- We do not have the <u>strength</u> within ourselves to take on life
 We need <u>Jesus' help</u>, always! (John 15:4-5)

The Storms of Life (Mark 4:35-41)

- While the Disciples were <u>overwhelmed</u> by the storm, Jesus was <u>asleep</u>

 He wasn't afraid of the storm
 He knew they were safe
- His <u>rebuke</u> of their <u>faith</u> is not because they didn't calm the storms
 They couldn't do that (v. 41)
- He rebuked them because they couldn't see past the storm to trust the One in <u>control</u> of it all
- That is what we are supposed to do Not handle the storms of life <u>alone</u>
 - ◦But <u>trust</u> the God who is bigger than the storm
 - Even if He doesn't <u>calm</u> them all
- God may even allow storms in our lives to help us understand our need for Him

"Even if..."

- We are called to trust God even if He doesn't bring us <u>out</u> of our troubles
 Ex.) Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego (Dan 3:16-18)
- We are called to trust God when He doesn't <u>heal</u> us
 Ex.) Paul (2 Cor. 12:7-10)
- Sometimes trusting God means <u>losing</u> everything else olt shows that He is of greatest <u>value</u> (Heb 11:35-40)

So What?

- God will give us more than we can handle *alone*! • But, if we trust Him, we are not alone
- Are we trusting Him to be our strength in every circumstance?
