The Gospel of John: The Challenge of Unbelief *John 12:36-50*

The Truthfulness of Scripture (v. 37-41)

- Despite Jesus' multiple public <u>signs</u> pointing to His <u>identity</u>, most of the crowds did not <u>believe</u> in Him
- John sees this as a <u>fulfillment</u> of God's words to the prophet Isaiah
 - oThe first quote is the opening verse of Isa 53, part of the <u>Suffering Servant's</u> Song (Isa 52:13-53:12)
 - It is clear from this side of the Cross that this is about <u>Iesus</u> (1 Pet 1:10-12)
 - o John references Isaiah's mission to Israel as well (Isa 6:9-10)
 - This text is immediately followed by the promise of Immanuel (Isa 7, esp. v. 14)
 - God used the <u>hard-heartedness</u> of some to bring about His <u>will</u> through Christ
 - And He still does

Faith & Fear (v. 42-43)

- Some of the crowds did respond in <u>faith</u> to Jesus, even among the leaders
 - o<u>Nicodemus</u> (Jn 2; 7:50; 19:39)
 - o Joseph of Arimathea (Mt 27:57; Mk 15:43; Jn 19:38)
- But a public declaration of faith in Jesus was costly
 - They risked their positions and maybe even their lives
 - OSo, they remained quiet about their faith, which John admonishes them for

The Final Plea (v. 44-50)

- Jesus makes a *final* plea to the crowd to put their <u>faith</u> in Him before He goes to the <u>Cross</u>
 - oThis section ends what is called the Book of Signs (1:19-12:50) and acts as a summary of the purpose of this part of the Gospel
 - oChapter 13 begins the Book of Glory (13:1-20:31), which focuses on Jesus' glorification through His death & resurrection
 - Jesus did not come as a <u>judge</u> but as a <u>Savior</u> o Judgement comes from a person's <u>rejection</u> of <u>Christ</u>
 - He offers eternal <u>life</u>
 - oIf we refuse, the eternal <u>punishment</u> that we deserve for our sins is what is left for us oJesus does not send people to <u>hell</u>
 - Our sin & our rejection of His grace, mercy, and love does
