# The Gospel of John: Grief to Joy

John 16:16-33

#### Joy (v. 16-24)

- Jesus tells the disciples that He will leave & return "in a little while"
- They are confused because He has repeatedly said that He is going to the <u>Father</u>, where they will not be able to see Him
- He tries to clarify that the world will <u>rejoice</u> over His 'departure' while the disciples <u>mourn</u> oBut their mourning will be <u>short-lived</u> and will turn to joy

• Joy: A deep <u>contentment</u> that comes from the *perspective* that God is in <u>control</u> oThe disciples need a <u>perspective</u> shift

- Like a mother endures <u>childbirth</u> for the joy of the child to come
- Jesus is referring to His <u>death</u> & <u>resurrection</u> • When He is <u>raised</u>, they will better understand • But the need for a shift in <u>perspective</u> is always needed in our relationship with God
- Jesus declares that after His resurrection & ascension, we direct our needs to the <u>Father</u> (v. 26-27) • This is done "in Jesus' name"/<u>authority</u>

## Limited Clarity (v. 25-30)

• Jesus clarifies that they will comprehend better later because He will be able to speak in ways that they can understand because:

oThe reality of His death & resurrection will make much of His statements clearer

oThe Holy Spirit helps us understand spiritual truth in ways that we cannot without Him

• This restatement helps the disciples have some insight, but it is limited

#### The Peace & The Promise (v. 31-33)

- Jesus questions whether they really comprehend
  - oTheir lack of true understanding will be shown when the disciples all <u>abandon</u> Him and lose <u>hope</u>
- Jesus comforts them by offering Him His peace & a promise

o'The Peace: Jesus will come back both through His resurrection & His second coming

oThe Promise: Living in this world means undergoing troubles

Jesus has <u>overcome</u>/<u>conquered</u> the world

## So What?

- Do we have an eternal perspective that God is at work, which gives peace & joy, or are we easily overwhelmed?
- Do we live in the victory of Jesus, or are we trying to fight alone?
