12 Principles for the OT Law

- 1. Do see the OT Law as God's <u>fully inspired word for you</u>
- 2. Don't see the OT Law as God's direct commands to you
- 3. Do see the OT Law as the basis for the Old Covenant
 - OAnd therefore, for Israel's history
- 4. Don't see the OT as binding for Christians under the New Covenant, except where specifically <u>renewed</u>
- 5. Do see God's justice, love, and high standards revealed in the OT Law
- 6. Don't forget to see that God's <u>mercy</u> is made equal to the severity of the standards
- 7. Do see the OT Law as a paradigm
 - OProviding examples for the full range of expected behaviors
- 8. Don't see the OT Law as complete
 - oIt is not technically comprehensive
- 9. Do remember that the <u>essence</u> of the OT Law is repeated in the Prophets and renewed in the New Covenant
 - oThat is the 10 Commandments & the 2 laws of Love
- 10. Don't expect to the OT Law to be <u>cited</u> frequently by the Prophets or the New Testament
 - OLegal citation was first introduced only in the Roman era, long after the OT was complete
- 11. Do see the OT Law as a generous gift to Israel
 - OBring blessings when obeyed
- 12. Don't see the OT Law as a grouping of <u>arbitrary</u>, annoying regulations limiting people's freedom
