# The Gospel of John: The Feast of Dedication

John 10:22-42

#### The Setting (v. 22-23)

- Jesus stays in Jerusalem into <u>December</u> for the Feast of Dedication

   An 8-day celebration of the rededication of the Temple under the Hasmoneans/Maccabees (164 BC) after its desecration by Antiochus IV (167 BC) (see Dan 9, 11, 12; 1 Macc 4:36-59)
   <u>Hannukah</u>
- Jesus has moved His place of teaching from the Temple Courts to Solomon's Colonnade on the eastern side of the Temple

• This was likely due to the <u>colder</u> weather

oIt's where the early <u>Church</u> would later gather (Acts 3:11; 5:12)

#### Telling It Plainly (v. 24-30)

- The Jews that gathered to hear Him, ask Jesus to tell them *plainly* if He is the Messiah
- Jesus rarely took on the title <u>Messiah/Christ</u> publicly due to its <u>political</u> & <u>military</u> overtones oThough said so privately, especially to non-Jews (4:26)
- He preferred to use other titles like <u>Shepherd</u> • Whose sheep are perfectly <u>secure</u> because He & His Father keep them safe
- Jesus claims that His <u>works</u> (miraculous signs) & <u>teaching</u> point to His identity plainly as <u>God's</u> <u>Son</u>
- oThis title can mean <u>Messiah</u> (see Ps 2), but Jesus makes a greater claim than simply being the descendant of David destined to be king
- oHe is claiming Trinitarian oneness with God (v. 30)

## The Son of God (v. 31-38)

• His opponents <u>understand</u> what Jesus is claiming, but they don't <u>believe</u> it oThey seek to stone Him for <u>blasphemy</u> because He is claiming to be <u>God</u>

- oThis is despite the many <u>noble/beautiful works (erga kala</u>) He has performed, which show who He and His Father are
- Jesus points them to Scripture that refers to 'gods' & 'sons of the Most High' (Ps 82:6-7) • Rabbis taught that this text referred to Israel at the time of the giving of the Law and the golden calf episode
  - oIsrael is repeatedly referred to as God's son (Ex 4:21-22; Hos 11:1)
- If this is true of Israel, how much more is it true of the One the Father <u>set apart & sent</u> oSet apart (*hagiazo*): <u>Sanctify</u>, <u>dedicate</u>, make <u>holy</u> oJesus is the <u>Sanctified Temple</u> that allows us to come to God in <u>holiness</u>
  - Thus, He fulfills the Feast of Dedication

## A Strategic Retreat (v. 39-41)

- Jesus' opponents try to harm Him, but He escapes and leaves Jerusalem
- Jesus retreats to where John's Gospel begins, the site of the <u>Baptizer's</u> early ministry oHe sees many put their <u>faith</u> in Him
