The Words of Jesus

- What Jesus said while on the Cross reflects His heart and the purpose of His ministry
- As we approach Easter, we will reflect on
 - OWhy Jesus came
 - ○Why He died
 - OAnd what His resurrection means

The Four Gospels

- Each Gospel offers a different <u>view</u> of the same events
- Each author highlights different elements of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus
- We will attempt to <u>chronologically</u> follow the conversations of Christ on the Cross
 Though, we cannot know for certain the exact order

The Context

• Jesus has been beaten and has walked the long way to Golgotha

○In Aramaic: "The Skull"

oIn Latin: <u>calvaria</u> (<u>Calvary</u>)

He is crucified and placed between two thieves

Jesus' Heart

- Forgiveness: To <u>pardon</u> the sins of another in order to <u>restore</u> a broken <u>relationship</u>
 This is why Jesus came (Luke 19:10)
- These people were <u>murdering</u> Him
 - OJesus' desire is to see them be restored to their heavenly Father
- Their ignorance does not make them guiltless
 - o Forgiveness implies the guilt of the forgiven party
- But it does make them blind to what God is doing

Practicing what He preached

- The adulterous woman
 - OBy Jesus' own admission, He alone could condemn her (John 8:7)
 - OAnd yet, He forgives her sin (John 8:10-11)
 - ○See Luke 7:36-50

His Words to Us

• We put Jesus on the Cross: Our sins; our rebellion

- And He died so that we might experience forgiveness
- What has anyone done to you that is worse than what that crowd and our sins did to Jesus? • We murdered Him as He loved us
- Who can you not forgive when you have been forgiven so much?! (Col. 3:12-13)

So What?

- Have we experienced the forgiveness that Jesus offers us through the Cross?
- Are we forgiving others like Jesus has forgiven us?
