## The Gospel of John: The Trial of Kings

John 18:28-19:16a

## Before Pilate (v. 18:28-40)

- After they finished questioning Him, the Jewish leaders bring Jesus to the praetorium, the headquarters of the Roman military in Jerusalem, to see <u>Pilate</u>, the Roman-appointed governor o But they refused to enter the residence because they believed being in a Gentile's residence makes them <u>unclean</u>, and therefore unable to partake in the <u>Passover</u>
- Pilate comes out to talk to them, asking what Jesus has done wrong
  - o The Synoptics report that the Chief Priest & Elders accuse Jesus of sedition against Rome, insisting that He be executed (Mt 27:12-13; Mk 15:3-4; Lk 23:2)
    - They brought Jesus to Pilate because, under Roman law, only Rome could <u>execute</u> someone
      - The Roman means of executing <u>dissidents</u> was public <u>crucifixion</u>
- Pilate asks Jesus if He is the king of the Jews (Messiah)

  o Jesus affirms this (Mt 27:11), but asks Pilate if this is his own conclusion

  o Pilate is offended at the thought of being pulled into Jewish religious squabbles
- Jesus assures Pilate that He is not seeking to <u>overthrow</u> Rome, but is setting up a <u>spiritual</u> <u>kingdom</u>, something that Pilate does not comprehend
- Jesus testifies to the <u>truth of His identity</u> & <u>mission</u>, but Pilate is <u>blind</u> to it o Pilate asks, "What is truth?" while the <u>Truth</u> is standing before him
- Pilate seeks to <u>release</u> Jesus for the first time, calling on a Passover custom

  Crownede as Taxable (Mark 15:7)
- Pilate seeks to <u>appease</u> the Jewish leaders without <u>killing</u> Jesus by having Him <u>beaten</u> and <u>ridiculed</u>, including:
  - ODressing Jesus like a king
    - Purple was the color of <u>royalty</u>
    - A <u>crown</u> twisted from the spikes of palms
  - OAnd mocking Him as a false king while beating Him
- When Pilate tries to release Jesus because Pilate sees He is not guilty, the crowd calls for His execution
  - oThe Jews insist on Jesus' death, claiming that He has committed <u>blasphemy</u> by calling Himself the <u>Son</u> of <u>God</u> (cf. Lev 24:16)
- This claim of divinity <u>frightens</u> Pilate, leading him to ask Jesus where He is from
- When Jesus doesn't answer, Pilate asks Jesus if He understands the <u>power</u> Pilate has over Him oJesus clarifies that the power Pilate has is from <u>God</u>, and thus will accomplish <u>God's will</u>

## Who Is the King? (19:12-16a)

- Pilate repeatedly tries to release Jesus, but the Jews are on the verge of <u>rioting</u> o'They even try to question Pilate's loyalty to the <u>Emperor</u> if he releases Jesus
- At this, Pilate sits on the judgment seat (bema) to give his official verdict
- He claims Jesus as their king, likely in a mocking way, but, as throughout John, in a way that is greater than he realizes.
  - They reject <u>Jesus</u> as king, claiming their king is the <u>Emperor</u>

- They choose the <u>world's</u> kingdom rather than <u>God's</u>
- Pilate finally relents and sends Jesus to be crucified
  - oJohn notes the time to draw attention to the fact that Jesus is being killed precisely when the Passover lamb is sacrificed

## So What?

- Pilate & the Jewish leaders had the Truth before them, but could not see it oDo we see Jesus as the source of truth?
- Which kingdom are we a part of, and which king do we serve?
