The Gospel of John: The Spirit's Work

John 15:26-16:15

The Testifying Spirit (15:26-16:6)

- Amid warning His disciples of the treatment they will endure from the world, Jesus reminds us that we are not alone
 - oThe Holy Spirit will be within us
- He will testify about Jesus
 - o And will empower His disciples to do the same
- Some of this maltreatment will come from those who claim to be God's people
 - oThis may take the form of synagogue ex-communication or even death
 - Both of which happen within Acts

The Convicting Spirit (16:7-11)

- Jesus tries to give them <u>perspective</u>, reminding them that His departure will benefit them because of the <u>presence</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> upon His return to the Father
- The Holy Spirit convicts the world of:
 - OSin: He seeks to convince us of our need for salvation from our sinfulness
 - When we put our faith in Jesus, we stop being a part of the <u>world</u> and start being part of His <u>kingdom</u>
 - ORighteousness: He exposes our self-righteous behavior & attitudes
 - Because Jesus returned to the Father, He gives us access to the Spirit, who <u>empowers</u> us to live in true righteousness, which <u>exposes</u> false righteousness by contrast
 - o <u>Judgment</u>: He shows the spiritual <u>blindness</u> of those who reject Him (7:24; 8:42-47)
 - The prince of this world (Satan), the source of this blindness, is defeated at the Cross

The Guiding Spirit (16:12-15)

- The Cross will not be the end of Jesus' work
- The Spirit continues the ministry of Jesus:
 - oGuiding us into God's truth
 - ORevealing the Father to us and in us
 - oEmpowering us to live like <u>Jesus</u>
