Hermeneutics in the Parables

The Uniqueness of Hermeneutics in the Parables

- Because the Parables were originally intended to be heard they seldom needed interpretation
- But because of our lack of knowledge of the original points of reference
 - OAnd because we have them in a written form
 - They do not 'catch' us in the same way
- Thus, our need to interpret

Steps to Interpretation

- 1. We must look at the parables in their <u>present biblical context</u>
 - Through their present context, we can use exeges to discover their 'point'
- 2. We can them translate that same point into our own context
 - This translation may involve retelling the story with the <u>points</u> of <u>references</u> translated to make sense to a modern hearer
 Good Samaritan example (p. 166)
 - This should only be attempted once you have done solid exegesis
- 3. Since all of Jesus' are in some way vehicles that proclaim the kingdom of God
 - It is necessary for us to immerse ourselves in the <u>meaning</u> of the kingdom in the ministry of Jesus
 - The message of the "already/not yet" nature of the kingdom is still needed today
