Ephesians: Love & Submission in Marriage

Ephesians 5:21-33

Submission

- When understood biblically, it's an expression of <u>love</u>
- ὑποτάσσω (hypotassō): a Greek military term meaning "to arrange [troop divisions] in a military fashion under the command of a leader"
 - OIn non-military use, "a voluntary attitude of giving in, cooperating, assuming responsibility, and carrying a burden."

God's Plan for Marriage (Gen 2:20b-24)

- God created men & women to complement one another
 - oEve was made to be a "helper" for Adam
 - This is not to say she is of lesser value
 - The term is almost always used to refer to <u>God Himself</u> (Ex 18:4; Dt 33:7, 26, 29; Ps 9:9; 10:14; 17:2; 30:10; 40:17; 46:1; 62:8; 70:5; 71:7; 72:12; 77:35; 115:9-11; 118:17; 119:114; 146:5; Heb 13:6)
- It is in this context that Paul speaks (Eph 5:31)

Wives (5:22-33)

- Wives are called to submit to their husbands
 - OAs if submitting to the Lord
 - Thus, there is an understanding that the husband is <u>submitting</u> to the Lord
 - It is based on an understanding of Christ's <u>leadership</u> role over the church
- Love is shown through <u>respect</u> (v. 33b)
 - oExpressed in support of your husband

Husbands (5:22-33)

- Husbands are called to love their wives, just like Christ loves the <u>Church</u> o<u>Committing</u> Himself to our needs
- Husbands, we are called to lay down our lives for our wives
 - OPutting their needs before ours
 - OServing them in love like Jesus serves us

So What?

- Christian marriage is meant to reflect the mysterious love between Christ and the Church
 - -How we love our spouses displays to the world the love of God
- Are we reading our "own mail"?
 - -Wives, how are you supporting your husbands?
 - -Husbands, how are you serving your wives?
