ACTS: Staying Focused (Acts 18:18-23)

The Departure (v. 18)

- Due to Gallio's hands-off approach, Paul was emboldened to stay in Corinth for a little while oBut begins to make plans to leave, allowing him time to have a proper <u>farewell</u>
- Priscilla & Aquila join him in the first part of his journey
- They depart through Corinth's eastern port of Cenchreae
 - OWhere he shaves his head as part of some vow
 - Likely a Nazarite vow (Num. 6:5)
 - The purpose of the vow is unknown, but it may have been a means of expressing <u>thanksgiving</u> and seeking the continued <u>blessing</u> of the Lord in his Corinthian mission in connection with his vision (v. 9–10)
 - If so, Paul may have grown out his hair for over 18 months and then shaved his head on the way back to Jerusalem where he would complete his vow
 - This shows that Paul still saw himself as part of the <u>Jewish</u> community

The Layover (v. 19-21)

- Paul & company travel to Ephesus
 - OA common port on a trip from Greece to the Judean coast
 - The leading city in the province of Asia
 - The 3rd largest city in the Roman Empire
- Once they arrived, Paul parted ways with <u>Priscilla</u> & <u>Aquila</u> who stay in Ephesus more long-term (v. 26)
- Paul spends a small amount of time* in the <u>synagogue</u> speaking with his fellow Jews about Jesus
 OBut when they ask him to stay, he <u>refuses</u>
 - This seems odd, but Paul clearly does not see it as God's will at the moment
 - He does return to Ephesus later
 - Instead, he remains <u>focused</u> on what God has directed him to do
 - That is, going to <u>Jerusalem</u> to finish his <u>vow</u>
- We all have 'layovers' that are filled with good things, but can ultimately <u>distract</u> us from God's will
- It may be that God will circle us back to them
 Or that they are for someone else to do
- But ultimately, we need to let God set our <u>direction</u> and hold our <u>focus</u>

Reporting & Revisiting (v. 22-23)

- Paul then finishes his sailing journey in <u>Caesarea</u>, the Mediterranean port for <u>Judea</u>
 oThen goes up* to visit the Church in <u>Jerusalem</u>, and probably complete his vow at the <u>Temple</u>
 by burning the hair he had shaved off
- He then finished his 2nd missionary journey by reporting to his <u>home</u> Church in <u>Antioch</u>
- But he doesn't stay long before going back to revisiting some of the Churches in <u>Galatia</u> & <u>Phrygia</u>, which begins his 3rd missionary journey

oHis motivation is to strengthen the newly birthed Christian communities
