# Names of God: El Roi

### Sarai, Hagar, & Abram (v. 1-6)

• Despite God's earlier promise for Abram to become a father of many nations (Gen 15), he and his wife still had no children at an old age

0 Abram was about <u>85</u> and Sarai was about <u>75</u>

- Rather than trusting the Lord's timing, Sarai took matters into her own hands oShe gave her Egyptian slave <u>Hagar</u> to Abram as a second wife to bear him children
  As a slave, Hagar would have no power in this decision
- When Hagar became pregnant, the <u>relationship dynamics</u> changed
- oHagar "thought little" of Sarai, perhaps not giving her the respect Sarai thought she deserved
- So rather than rejoicing at her plan succeeding, Sarai got <u>angry</u> oBlaming <u>Abram</u> for the situation
- Abram did nothing to <u>protect</u> Hagar or his unborn child • Rather he told Sarai to handle it as she saw fit
- Sarai mistreated Hagar, forcing her to flee into the desert

### God's Intervention (v. 7-12)

- When Hagar had stopped to rest at a spring, God sent an angel to speak to Hagar
- His message:
  - oGo back to Sarai and submit to her
    - Addressing Hagar's <u>attitude</u>
  - oGod will bless Hagar with numerous descendants
  - Like His promise to <u>Abram</u>
  - oShe will give birth to a son who will have a wild disposition and whose descendants will live in <u>animosity</u> towards his brothers' descendants
    - Ishmael: "God hears"

## *El Roi* (v. 7-12)

- *El* R*oi:* "The God who <u>sees me</u>" • God saw her <u>struggle</u> and <u>met</u> her in it
- Beer Lahai Roi: "The well of the Living One who sees me"
- Hagar returns and gives birth to Ishmael • This is not the only time God interceded for Hagar & Ishmael (Gen 21:8-21)
