Immanuel: The Gift of Hope

Isaiah 7:1-17; Matthew 1:23

The Setting (v. 1-2)

- Ahaz is the king of Judah (Southern Kingdom)
 From the line of <u>David</u>
 c. 735 BC
- Aram and Israel come to make war against Judah
- Ahaz and the people fear for the safety of Jerusalem (v. 2b)

The Message (v. 3-9)

- Isaiah and his son go to meet Ahaz at the Washer's Field (v. 3) • Shear-Jashub: "A <u>remnant</u> will return" • Washer's Field: city <u>water</u> system
- The Lord assures Ahaz that his enemies will fail oAs long as he <u>trusts</u> in the Lord (v. 9b)

The Sign (v. 10-14)

- The Lord tells Ahaz to ask for a sign of His <u>faithfulness</u> oAhaz feigns <u>piety</u> and refuses (v. 11-12)
- God scolds Ahaz and gives him a <u>double-edged</u> sign oImmanuel: "God [is] with us"

Immanuel (v. 14-17)

- The sign has 2 fulfillments (v. 14)
- Immediate fulfillment: "This young woman" (*Haʿalma*) o <u>Isaiah's</u> 2nd son, Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz (Isa. 8) o This child will act as a <u>reminder</u> that God is with the Davidic line o 12-13 years later (v. 15-16)
 - oResult: Aram & Israel will be destroyed (c. 722 BC)
 - But at the hands of Assyria, who will subject Judah
- Ultimate fulfillment: "The virgin" (hā parthenos)
 - OA miracle: This child will **be** God with us
 - 0700+ years later
 - oResult: God becomes a man (John 1:14)
- One meaning: God will keep His <u>promise</u> to <u>David</u> (2 Sam. 7:12-14a) o Giving God's people the gift of <u>hope</u>
- Matthew saw what God did through Isaiah as a <u>foreshadow</u> of Christ o Typology

So What?

- Jesus is God's gift of hope
 OHe is our constant reminder that God is with us
- We can trust Him because He keeps His promises
