Colossians 1:1-2a

What is Colossians?

- It is one of Paul's letters written to a struggling congregation
 OWritten with <u>Timothy</u> (v. 1)
 - Who was from the nearby <u>Derbe-Lystra</u> area (Acts 16:1)
- It was written around AD 60 to 62
- It was written while Paul was in prison
 Possibly in <u>Rome</u>
- It was written to the church in Colossae

The City of Colossae

- In Paul's day, was considered a "small town"
 Overshadowed by nearby Laodicea (Col 4:15–16)
- But due to its history as a military outpost and its previous grandeur, it was home to a mixture of people groups

 \circ Phrygians, Greeks, Romans, Scythians and Jews (see Col. 3:11)

- The Church was probably founded by <u>Epaphras</u> (1:7; 4:12-13)
 Between AD 53-55
 - About <u>7</u> to <u>10</u> years before the writing of the Epistle

The Issue at Colossae

- False teachers threatened to undermine what Epaphras had taught
 Which threatened to undermine the church from its strong <u>Christ-centered</u> foundation
- Thus, Paul's message throughout Colossians is:
 Christ must be center to the life of the <u>Church Body</u>
 Christ must be center to the life of the <u>Church members</u>

Christ the Center

• When Christ is not the center of life the <u>church</u> it fails to be the <u>Church</u>

- $\circ \mbox{The community which:}$
 - Is <u>called out</u> to be different from the world
 - Which is why Paul calls the Colossians 'saints'
 - Reflects Christ's <u>kingship</u> to the world
 - Which is why Paul calls them '<u>faithful</u>'
 - Is a new <u>family</u> in Christ
 - Which is why Paul calls them 'brothers'*
- The Church is called to offer the world an alternative

○Which can only be found in <u>Jesus</u>

• When we keep Him at the <u>center</u>
