James: Who Holds Tomorrow?

(James 4:3-17)

Boastful Plans (v. 13-16)

- James warns of how we <u>plan</u> our futures
- Plans that are based on our <u>human efforts</u> and <u>understanding</u> have no guarantee of <u>success</u> oWe have no way of <u>predicting</u> the future, much less <u>controlling</u> it
- James reminds us of the <u>fleeting</u> nature of our <u>mortal</u> existence
- The rebuke is not against plans in general, but rather, the <u>grip</u> in which we hold them oWe must hold our plans <u>loosely</u>
 - oWe must submit our plans to God's will (Pro 16:3)
 - Failure to do so is <u>arrogance</u>

The Sin of Omission (v. 17)

- James reminds us that failing to do what we know is right is <u>sinful</u> o'This reflects <u>Jesus</u>' teaching (Luke 19:11-27; Matt 25:31-46)
- Both our planning & our omissions reflect the condition of our hearts (Pro 16:1-2)

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 James returns to a milder address with his audience: From "adulterous people" (v. 4) to "brothers & sisters" (v. 11)
• He commands them to stop one another
