## Ephesians: Walking the Talk

(Ephesians 4:1-6)

## The Walk (v. 1-3)

- Paul's plea with the church is to walk in a manner worthy of the calling we have received
- This "Calling" is the new <u>identity</u> we have in Jesus oNot unique to certain people in the Church
- The walk is further defined by:
  - o Humility: putting the needs of others before your own (Phil 2:3-4; Rom 12:3, 16)
  - oGentleness: meekness; inward attitude of grace towards others (1 Pet 3:15-16; Gal 6:1)
  - o<u>Patience</u>: long-suffering; the ability to endure annoyance and difficulties over a period of time (1 Tim 1:16; 2 Pet 3:15)
  - o<u>Putting</u> up with one another in <u>love</u>: enduring the <u>wrong-doings</u> & <u>annoyances</u> of others out of Christ's love for them (Col 3:13)
  - OA desire for unity & peace: being like-minded
    - Not my mind or your mind; but Christ's mind given through the Spirit (1 Cor. 12:13-16)
    - Which requires <u>effort</u> on our part (v. 3; Rom 12:18)

## Unity's Source (v. 4-6)

- We can be in unity because we are <u>one</u> through the <u>Spirit</u>
  Unity is NOT thinking the same about everything
  It is finding our <u>identity</u> & <u>purpose</u> in the same source: <u>Jesus</u>
- We share in one hope
  - Our common Master
  - Our unifying faith
  - Our shared identity
    - <u>Baptism</u> is a marker of this new <u>identity</u> in Christ
    - A symbol of sharing in Christ's <u>death</u> & <u>resurrection life</u> (Rom 6:3-5)
  - Our God, who is <u>One</u> (Deut. 6:4)
    - Who is <u>Father</u> of all (3:15)
      - Making us one <u>family</u> (2:11-22)

## So What?

- When we find our identity in Christ, the Spirit gives us the ability to live that identity out
- Are we walking the talk?
- Are our lives marked by humility, gentleness, patience, love and unity?
