Various Texts

The Claim: "You have to learn the hard way."

• Underlying premise: Wisdom is only learned through <u>personal experience</u> • Often through <u>mistakes</u>

Scripture's Truth

- What is wisdom?
 - ○The <u>insight</u> to apply <u>truth</u> to a situation
 - ○Not the same as <u>knowledge</u>
- Wisdom is of great value (Pro. 16:16)
- Wisdom is found from 3 sources

<u>Personal Experience</u> as a Teacher

- The pros:
 - olt can teach us valuable lessons
 - Ex.) Ecclesiastes
 - God uses it as to <u>redeem</u> our <u>mistakes</u>
 - Ex.) Judah (Gen. 37:26; 39, 43-44)
- The con: We can come to the <u>wrong</u> conclusions
 Ex.) Job's friends

<u>Others' Experience</u> as a Teacher

- We can learn from the experiences, and even mistakes, of others (Pro 13:20; Job 12:12)
- Pros:
 - •We can glean from others' experiences
 - •We don't have repeat their <u>mistakes</u>
- Con: We can come to the same wrong conclusions that they have come to

The Source of Wisdom

- Jesus Himself is the source of true wisdom (1 Cor. 1:22-25, 30)
- To know God is to know wisdom (Pro 9:10; Eph 1:17)
- He gives us wisdom when we seek Him (Jas 1:5)
- Every other claim of <u>truth</u> or <u>wisdom</u> must be brought before Him (1 John 4:1) • Thus, we should <u>root</u> ourselves in His truth
 - Grounded in <u>Scripture</u>
 - Centered in <u>Jesus</u>

So What?

Are we seeking God for wisdom to understand what we see in the world?

 We gain wisdom through godly men and women who have come before us
 God will use our experiences, both good and bad to teach us wisdom
 But it all must center in JESUS!
