### Immanuel: The Gift of Peace

Isaiah 9:1-7

### The Setting (Isa 8:21-22)

- Isaiah is telling the people of the coming <u>Assyrian</u> forces and the short-term effects they will bring against Israel & Judah
- God was about to <a href="https://humble.ncb/humble">humble</a> His people

## A Light in the Darkness (v. 1-4)

- Israel's <u>humbling</u> will not be permanent (v. 1)
- Honor will come where the hammer first fell: Galilee
- A <u>light</u> will come into their darkness • Just like it did in <u>Gideon</u>'s day (v. 4; Jdg 7)

### The Child of Peace (v. 5-7)

- God's people will burn up their <u>war-gear</u> because <u>conflict</u> will end (v. 5)
- This peace will not be brought about by another war-bent king, but rather by a child (v. 6a)
- He will rule as king (v. 6b)
- He will belong to the line of <u>David</u> (v. 7b)
- But He will not be just another <u>human</u> king oHis reign will last <u>forever</u> (v. 7a-b)
- He will be known as:
  - oWonderful <u>Counselor</u> (John 14:16, 26; 15:26; 16:7)
  - oMighty God (John 1:1)
  - o Everlasting Father (John 10:30)
  - oPrince of Peace (Luke 2:14)

# Fulfillment in Jesus

- John saw Jesus as that <u>light</u> in the <u>darkness</u> (John 1:4-5)
- Zechariah, John the Baptist's father, alludes to this Scripture at the end of his <u>prophecy</u> about <u>Jesus</u> (Luke 1:26-29)
- Matthew saw Jesus' ministry in Galilee as a fulfillment of this promise (Matt 4:13-16)
- Jesus is God's gift of <u>peace</u>
  oIn His first coming, He gave us peace with God (Rom 5:1)
  oIn His second coming, He will bring an end to all conflict (Isa 9:7)
