A Song of Trust: I Will Not Fear (Ps. 23:4)

The Valley of the Shadow of Death

- David acknowledges that sheep do not always stay in the green pastures near refreshing waters
- But on occasion, they make their way into the deep valleys of the desert oWhich are extremely <u>arid</u> and <u>dangerous</u>
- This represents the <u>hardest</u> & <u>darkest</u> days of our lives
 OWhen we may feel far from <u>God</u> and His <u>provision</u>
 OPerhaps due to our own <u>wandering</u> or circumstances beyond our <u>control</u>

I Will Fear No Evil

- Yet, David declares his confident <u>trust</u> in the LORD, stating his lack of <u>fear</u> oBecause of God's <u>presence</u> even in the hardship
 - Even when we have <u>wandered</u> (Luke 15:4-5)

They Comfort Me

- David finds comfort in the tools of the Shepherd • Rod/Club: Used to <u>protect</u> the sheep from wild animals • Staff/Crook: Used to <u>guide</u> and <u>control</u> the sheep
 - Including <u>correcting</u> and <u>saving</u> them as needed
- Our comfort and secure is found in our Good Shepherd's <u>protection</u> and <u>guidance</u> oAnd seeking us when we wander from the safety of His side

So What?

- Are we finding our security and comfort in the LORD, our Good Shepherd?
- Are we letting Him guide and correct us?
