The Gospel of John: The Bread of Life John 6:22-71

The Search (v. 22-25)

• After the crowds realize that Jesus left the area, they travel back to <u>Capernaum</u> to find Him oHe is in the <u>Synagogue</u> (v. 59)

Motive & Meaning (v. 26-34)

- Jesus calls out the crowd's motive: They want more <u>free food</u> oThey experienced the <u>miracle</u> but missed its <u>meaning</u>
- He urges them to look past the <u>temporal</u>, <u>material</u> food to that which gives <u>eternal life</u>, which He can give
 - oThe sign points to His identity & ability to provide eternal life
- They think they need to work for eternal life
 OHe tells them that faith in Him is the only prerequisite
- They ask for more <u>proof</u> but are really looking for more <u>food</u> like <u>manna</u> oThey are looking for a new <u>Moses</u>; He is offering them <u>God</u> Himself

Heavenly Bread (v. 35-40)

- Jesus is the <u>Bread</u> that gives <u>eternal life</u> • He is the one God the Father has sent to provide for our <u>spiritual hunger</u> & <u>thirst</u> (4:10, 14; Isa 55:1-2)
- Despite the signs they've witnessed, some still refuse to believe in Him
- But those who put their faith in Jesus have <u>eternal life</u>, both <u>now</u> and at the <u>resurrection</u> o'This is a divine <u>promise</u> centered on <u>God's</u> work, not ours

A Hard Teaching (v. 41-71)

- Some in the crowd know Jesus' family and find His claim to come from heaven hard to believe
- Jesus explains that to come to Him begins with God's <u>initiative</u> oFaith begins and ends with <u>God</u>
 - OAnd we hear & see God through the person of Jesus
- Jesus offers Himself (on the Cross) to give <u>life</u> to the world (v. 51) oThus, we must <u>consume</u> & be <u>consumed</u> by Jesus to have <u>eternal life</u>
- The imagery of flesh & blood is <u>misunderstood</u> by both the crowds & His disciples oMany take it literally
 - oBut Jesus explained its meaning before He uses the metaphor (v. 35)
 - To eat His body = to $\underline{\text{come}}$ to Him
 - To drink His blood = to <u>believe</u> in Him
 - 'Believe, and you have eaten' -St. Augustine of Hippo
- This misunderstanding causes some to <u>abandon</u> Jesus oThus, demonstrating that they may not have been following with the right <u>hearts/motives</u>
- But the inner circle of disciples stays
 They <u>trust</u> Jesus even when they don't <u>understand</u> (v. 68)
- Jesus explains that they have this <u>faith</u> because He <u>chose</u> them oEven though one of them will <u>betray</u> Him

So What?

- Jesus is the one who alone can offer us eternal life
- Have we put our faith in Him?
- Do we trust Him even when we don't understand?
