# Signs of the Messiah: Water to Wine

(John 2:1-11)

### The Wedding (v. 1-5)

- Jesus, His disciples, & His mother are invited to a wedding in Cana
  OCana: A small village about 9 miles north of Nazareth
  - Nathanael's hometown (John 21:2)
- Probably the wedding of a <u>relative</u> or close <u>friend</u> of Jesus' family
  OMary's role may have been to help with the meal
- Weddings could last up to a week
  - oThe groom & his family were responsible for provisions
  - oTo run out of wine or food would have brought shame on the family
- When Mary informs Jesus of the lack of wine, His response is <u>terse</u> (v. 4a)
  - OAs her eldest son, Mary had probably come to <u>rely</u> on Jesus
  - OBut He is now distancing Himself from His family
  - Her later response shows her <u>faith</u> in Him (v. 5)
- Instead, as Jesus embarks on His divine mission, the thing that guides Him is His <u>Father's</u> will (v. 4b)
  - oJesus' hour = When His glory would be revealed to the world, ultimately through His death & resurrection
    - Though, His glory is on display throughout each of the signs in various ways

## The Sign (v. 6-10)

- Jesus seizes this opportunity to point to His disciples who He is
- He utilizes 6 <u>ceremonial</u> <u>washing</u> jars
  - OUsed by Jews to cleanse their hands, faces, & perhaps utensils
    - The water represents the old ways & customs which Jesus has come to replace
- Jesus commands them to be filled with <u>freshly drawn</u> water oAbout <u>100-150</u> gallons
- It is then served to the head steward, who declares it the <u>superior</u> to the previous wine oWine= <u>Fermented</u> (v. 10)
  - Though perhaps diluted to about 1/10 the strength of strong wine
- The <u>abundance</u> of wine points to what Jesus has come to do oUsher in a new age marked by God pouring out His <u>blessings</u> lavishly
- This was foretold by the Prophets as a sign of the <u>Messianic</u> age (Isa. 25:6-8; Amos 9:13; Jer. 31:12; Hos. 14:7)
- Jesus later adopts the <u>wedding</u> as a symbol for the consummation of the Messianic age (Mt. 22:1-14; 25:1-13)
- Thus, this sign is an acted parable, pointing to Jesus as the one who ushers in the Messianic age

# The Response (v. 11)

- This is referred to as Jesus' <u>first/beginning</u> sign
  The <u>Messianic</u> age has begun (John 1:1)
- His glory is being revealed (John 1:14)

oThough first only to these few disciples

• The result is they begin to put their <u>faith</u> in Him oThat is what signs are meant to do (John 20:31)

## So What?

- Jesus ushers in a new age of God's abundant blessings
- We are welcomed to the wedding as the most honored guest, His bride (John 3:29; Rev 19:7; 21:2, 9; 22:17)
- Have we accepted His proposal?

Meditation Verse: Isaiah 25:6-8
