The Gospel of John: The High Priestly Prayer John 17

Jesus Prays for Himself (v. 1-5)

- This passage is known as the <u>High Priestly Prayer</u> because Jesus acts as <u>intercessor</u> for His people, which is the role of the <u>High Priest</u>
- Jesus' glorification is at hand oGlory/glorify here means to "clothe in splendor" or "show His fullness"
- Jesus desires that the world sees Him for who He truly is from eternity past (v. 5)
 - OAnd by extension, for them to know who His Father truly is
 - oThis is not aggrandizement, but true revelation
- The purpose is to fulfill His mission:
 - oTo draw all people to Jesus so that they might have eternal life
 - oEternal life = Knowing God through <u>Iesus</u>

Jesus Prays for His Disciples (v. 6-19)

- Jesus shifts His focus to praying for those friends He has trained and will immediately continue His mission
 - ODeclaring that they are the first-fruits of those who will follow Him
- He prays for His Father to:
 - o Protect them the world & the evil one, not <u>remove</u> them from the world (v. 11a, 15)
 - o<u>Unite</u> them (v. 11b)
 - oContinue the joy He has given them (v. 13)
 - An eternal perspective, even in suffering
 - OSanctify them by God's truth
 - Make <u>holy/set apart</u>

Jesus Prays for Us (17:20-26)

- Jesus then prays for those who will believe because of the <u>witness</u> of His disciples oThis includes us
- Jesus prays for our:
 - OUnity: This testifies to the truth of the Gospel
 - This is the work of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> in us all
 - O<u>Destiny</u>: Eternity with God
 - oContinuation of His Jesus' mission to make God known to the world
