The Servant's Song

- Over 700 years before Jesus' crucifixion, God spoke to the prophet Isaiah
- He foretold the coming of one whose <u>suffering</u> and <u>death</u> would accomplish God's plan o'The <u>Suffering Servant</u>

The Suffering Servant

- The Servant would:
 - oBe <u>lifted</u> up (Isa 52:13; John 3:14; 8:28; 12:32)
 - oBe <u>rejected</u> by people (Isa 52:14; 53:2-3; Mark 8:31; 9:12; Luke 9:22; 17:25; John 3:36; 12:48)
 - oBe pierced for our sins (Isa 53:4-6; John 19:34; Rev 1:7)
 - He would bear the <u>punishment</u> that our sins deserve (1 Pet 3:18)
 - So, we could have peace with God
 - And be healed from our <u>rebellious</u> hearts (1 Pet 2:24-25)
 - oNot <u>resist</u> his accusers (Isa 53:7; Matt 26:63; 27:14; Mark 14:61; Acts 8:32-33)
 - o<u>Die</u> among the wicked (Isa 53:8-9, 12; Luke 23:32-43)
 - Though he was innocent of <u>sin</u> (1 Pet 2:22)
 - OBe buried with the rich (Isa 53:9; Matt 27:57)
 - oFulfill God's plan to save His people from their sin (Isa 53:10a)
 - OBe raised from the dead (Isa 53:10b-11a; Matt 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; John 20)
 - oMake <u>righteous</u> those who know him (Isa 53:11b; Rom 3:24)
 - oGather those from the whole world to be God's people (Isa 53:12; Matt 28:18-19)

Who Is This Servant?

- Isaiah did not know who the Servant would be, but we do
- The Servant is <u>Jesus</u>, the <u>Son</u> of God
 - OWho suffered for our sins on the Cross
 - oWho died in our place
 - oWho was <u>raised</u> to life again
 - oWho offers us peace with God through faith in Him
