The Coming of the Savior

Luke 2:10-14, various texts

Why a Baby?

- Why did we need this child to come into the world the way He did?

 oIf God wanted to step into human history, could He had done so without becoming human?

 oOr could He had simply come as an adult?
- Not if He wanted to accomplish all His mission
 Including being the Savior of humanity (Luke 2:11-12)
- Jesus coming as a baby was a sign that He came to be our Savior
- He came to be human in every way, so that He might <u>experience</u> every aspect of humanity: oIn order to <u>sympathize</u> with us (Heb. 4:15)
 - Thus, the <u>rags</u> & <u>manger</u>
 - Before this, Jesus did not know what poverty was like, because, as God, He owned all things
 - Before this, Jesus did not know what <u>powerlessness</u> was like, because, as God, He was <u>all-powerful</u>
 - So, He took on the <u>lowest</u>, most <u>vulnerable</u> of humanity to know what it was truly like to be human (Phil. 2:6-8)
 - oIn order to redeem it all (Tts 2:14; Col. 1:17-22)
 - In order for Jesus to do His <u>redemptive</u> work on the Cross, He needed to be an appropriate <u>substitute</u> for us (Heb. 2:17)

The Great Savior

- Jesus came to be our Savior because we needed saving
 - oFrom our sins
 - oFrom death
 - oFrom ourselves
- That's why He is named 'Jesus' (Matt. 1:21) oIt means "The Lord saves"

So What?

- We celebrate Jesus coming to be our Great Savior
 OSaving us from our sins, death, and ourselves
- Are we trusting Him to do this in us?
 And declaring it to the world!
