## Centered in Christ: Out with the Old

Colossian 3:5-11

## Putting the Old Man Down (v. 5-7)

- Paul calls us to put to <u>death</u> everything in us that is at odds with the <u>new life</u> that Christ is building in us
  - $\circ$  Because we have <u>died</u> to our old lives (v. 3)
- This includes:
  - Sexual immorality (porneia): refers to any kind of sexual sin
  - Impurity: refers more generally to any kind of moral corruption
  - Passion: refers to sinful sexual <u>thoughts</u>; <u>lust</u>
  - Evil desire: Refers to the human sinful impulse
    - Our default mode apart from Christ is to <u>sin</u>
  - Covetousness: Greed; an inappropriate desire for more
    - This can mean <u>money</u>, <u>power</u>, <u>pleasure</u>, etc.
    - Which Paul equates with <u>idolatry</u>
      - Because it is placing a love for things over our love for God
- This way of living is what leads to death
  - But it also led Jesus to the Cross to remove the <u>wrath</u> that our sinful life deserves (see John 3:36; Rom. 1:18; 2:5, 8; 3:5-6; 5:9; 1 Thess. 1:10; 5:9)
- But notice Paul's use of the <u>past</u> tense in v. 7
  Something has changed

## Taking off the Old Self (v. 8-11)

- We are called to change
  - Starting with how we <u>think</u>
    - Anger, Wrath, & Malice: <u>negative</u>, <u>vengeful</u> thoughts towards other
  - Moving to how we <u>speak</u>
    - Slander: <u>Tearing</u> other down
    - Obscene talk: <u>Blasphemy</u>; speaking wrongly about <u>God</u>
  - $\circ$ Which results in <u>lying</u> to one another
- This change comes about as we put off the old self
  - And take up our new <u>identity</u> in Christ
  - When we seek Jesus, we begin to look more and more like Him
  - And this includes no longer seeing ourselves or others by <u>ethnicity</u> or <u>social</u> standing (v. 11)

## So What?

• If Jesus has made us new, are we putting the old us to death? • And are we ready for Him to conform us to look like He does?
