Ephesians: Marks of Holiness

Ephesians 5:3-7

Holiness Lived Out (v. 3-4)

- We are called to live in <u>holiness</u>
 - OAs those who have been set apart by God
 - oTherefore, we should look different from the world
- This includes ceasing sinful actions, thoughts, and speech
 - OWhich Paul calls shameful
- Shameful actions:
- OSexual immorality (porneia): Any sexual act outside the confines of marriage
- Shameful thoughts:
 - oImpurity: unclean thoughts
 - Lust
 - Impure motives
 - oGreed: a desire for more; covetousness
- Shameful speech:
 - Obscenity: vulgar language; curses
 - oFoolish talk: that which doesn't glorify God
 - OCourse joking: making light of things that are serious
- The solution to all of these is Thanksgiving

Living Out Our Inheritance (v. 5)

- Paul insists that no one whose life is defined by the previously mentioned sins has an inheritance in God's kingdom
 - OHe is referring to those whose lives are <u>defined</u> by the sins listed in v. 3
- Their inheritance in the kingdom is not in jeopardy
- Rather, their identity is in question
 - OBecause their lives do not reflect the inward change that results with a new identity in Christ

The Company We Keep (v. 6-7)

- Paul warns us of those who <u>deceive</u> with empty words
 - OBoth those who claim Christ and not adhere to His truth
 - This is the group often alluded to when there is language of God's wrath in the NT
 - OAnd those who do not know Christ
- We are not <u>partner</u> with them (2 Cor 6:14)
 - This is a reference to:
 - <u>Marriage</u>
 - <u>Business</u> partners
 - <u>Close</u> friendships
