Signs of the Messiah: Feeding the Hungry

(John 6:1-59)

The Setting (v. 1-4)

- An indeterminate amount of time has passed since Jesus healed the paralytic oHe has returned to Galilee and travels to the east side of the Sea of Galilee
- A crowd follows Him there because of the signs they have seen
- It is near <u>Passover</u>, reflecting on a time of God's <u>deliverance</u> & <u>provision</u> oDeliverance: To many Jews, that meant freedom from Roman rule (see v. 15) oProvision: God had provided the Israelites food after their departure from Egypt

The Sign (v. 5-15)

- Jesus sees the need of the people, and asks the disciples for a solution
 Their response is <u>human-centered</u>: Impossible due to <u>limited</u> resources
- Jesus shows them that His resources are <u>boundless</u>
 OHe not only provides food for the crowd of <u>20,000</u>, but there are <u>leftovers</u>
- The people see this as a <u>sign</u> that Jesus is the promised <u>Prophet</u> that <u>Moses</u> spoke of (Deut. 18:15)
 - oThis may have reminded them of the miraculous feeding through Elisha (2 Kgs 4:42-44)
- They even are hoping to make Him king through <u>forceful rebellion</u>
 Something Jesus wants nothing to do with

The Bread of Life (v. 25-59)

- The crowd searches for Jesus, who has crossed the lake on <u>foot</u> (v. 16-24), and find Him in the synagogue in Capernaum (v. 59)
- Jesus points out that what they seek is not <u>Him</u>, but the <u>free food</u> He provided oHe tells them to <u>believe</u> that He is sent from God His Father
- They want manna as a sign that God sent Him
- He calls them to seek true <u>bread/food</u> from heaven = <u>Jesus Himself</u> • He is the one that <u>provides</u> and <u>satisfies</u> <u>eternally</u>
- Many struggle to accept this truth
 - OEspecially as Jesus equates the bread of life with His own flesh and blood
 - oThey misunderstand His claim, which is made clearer with His disciples at the <u>Last Supper</u> (Mk 14:22-26)
- Because of this hard truth, many turned away from Him (v. 60-66)

So What?

- Jesus is the provider and the eternal satisfier
 OWe need to be filled by Him to have eternal life
- Are we looking for Him to provide?
- Do we find ultimate satisfaction in Him?
- Are we letting Him fill us?
