#### **ACTS: Thessalonica**

Acts 17:1-9

#### Westward, Ho! (v. 1-4)

- Paul & co. travel 30 miles south and west along the Via Egnatia to Amphipolis, the capital of the first district of Macedonia
- Then they go 27 miles to Apollonia
- Finally, 35 miles to Thessalonica, the capital of both the second district & the whole province
- Paul makes a strategic choice by targeting Thessalonica
  - OA seaport on the Thermaic Gulf, linking sea & land routes to the interior of Macedonia
  - oIt served as a center for the spread of the <u>Gospel</u> to the whole <u>Balkan</u> peninsula (see Rom 15:19; 1 Thess. 1:7–8)
- As usual, Paul goes to the synagogue to preach for 3 weeks in a row
  - oUsing the OT, he points of the <u>prophetic</u> texts that foretell how the Christ must <u>suffer</u> & rise from the dead
  - OAnd shows that Jesus fulfilled this in his death & resurrection
- Some <u>Jews</u> & many <u>Gentiles</u> put their faith in Jesus

### The Power Struggle (v. 5-9)

- <u>Jealousy</u> leads some of the Jewish men to rile up the city
  OMuch like in <u>Philippi</u>, though different motives
- When they can't find Paul & Silas, they drag out some new local converts, including a man named Jason
  - oThey are charged with public disturbance, harboring disturbers of the peace, & defying Caesar
- The charge of defying Caesar was based on the claim that <u>Jesus</u> is king
  - OOther religions had concepts of God-kings, including Zeus
  - oHowever, Paul's preaching on Jesus, the <u>God-man</u>, who would come again to be <u>king</u> would sound like a threat to the rule of the <u>Emperor</u> (1 Thess. 1:9-10; 2 Thess. 2:5-8)
- Jason gives bond money to the officials allowing for their release with the conditions:
  - oNo more public disturbances
  - oPaul & Silas would leave the city
    - Which they do (v. 10)

## Who's the King?

- Ironically, the Jews who were led by a misguided zeal to protect the reputation & glory of God, undermined it by declaring allegiance to Caesar over Jesus
- Paul wasn't demanding that Christians disobey <u>Caesar</u>
  In fact, he <u>commanded</u> them to (Rom. 13:1-7)
  - oAs did Peter (1 Pet. 2:13-17)
- Rather, we are to have our <u>ultimate</u> <u>allegiance</u> to king <u>Jesus</u>
  - oGod is our ultimate authority
  - OJesus is our eternal King
