Signs of the Messiah: The True Temple

(John 2:13-25)

The Feast (v. 13-17)

- Shortly after the wedding in Cana (2:1-11), Jesus travels with His disciples to Jerusalem to participate in the <u>Passover</u>
 - o Passover: The Jewish feast remembering God's deliverance of Israel from Egypt (see Ex. 12)
- Jews from all around the ancient world returned to Jerusalem to worship & to give the <u>Temple</u> tax
 - oThe merchants' stands were to provide sacrifices for those who had to travel
 - oThe money-changers stands were to exchange different currencies for the <u>silver half-drachma</u> required to be given by all Jewish males 20 years and older
- Jesus' issue was not with the tables' existence, it was with their placement
 - ORather than in the Kidron Valley away from the Temple, they had been placed in the Court of the Gentiles
 - The place of worship for the nations had been turned into a marketplace
- John points out the <u>OT</u> connection with Jesus' actions & words (Ps 69:9)
 - oThese are King David's words concerning his enemies
 - Something that Jesus emulates as the promised <u>Davidic King/Messiah</u>

The Sign (v. 18-22)

- The response by the Jewish leadership is disbelief that Jesus would have the <u>audacity</u> to commit such an act
 - OJesus is fairly unknown at this point
- So, they ask for a <u>sign</u> of His <u>authority</u> to do such a thing o'They don't seem to be concerned with whether <u>justice</u> or right <u>worship</u>, just <u>power</u>
- Jesus offers them the sign of the <u>Temple</u> itself
 OHe says that if *they* destroy it, *He* can raise it in 3 days
- The Jews see this claim as preposterous, since the 2nd Temple took <u>46</u> years to complete
- Jesus offers a cryptic foretelling of His <u>death</u> & <u>resurrection</u> which points to His role as the <u>replacement</u> of the Temple itself
 - OIt is not necessarily a <u>miracle</u> in the moment, but rather points toward the ultimate display of His <u>glory</u>
- He later explains this more plainly (John 4:23-24)
 And it isn't until much later that His <u>disciples</u> realize it

Signs & Faith (v. 23-25)

- John states that Jesus was performing other <u>signs</u> while at the Feast, but doesn't specify what they are (John 20:30)
 - OSome of which are recorded in the Synoptics
- These signs caused some to put their <u>trust</u> in Jesus oBecause that's what signs are meant to do (John 20:31)
- But Jesus did not fully entrust people with who He was yet oIn part due to <u>misconceptions</u> about what the Messiah was supposed to do

So What?

- Jesus, as the true representation of God, offers us the ability to worship in Spirit and truth oWe can come to the Father through Him wherever we are
- Have we come to the true Temple?
 Oo we worship in Spirit and in truth?
