Ephesians: Love & Submission at Work

Ephesians 6:5-9

The Call to Work

- Like marriage & family, God created us to work (Gen 2:15)
- Work is <u>good</u>
- oIt being toilsome is the result of the Fall (Gen 3:17b)
- Like marriage, family, and every other aspect of human existence, God's plan in Christ involves redeeming our work

Servants/Employees (6:5-8)

- Bondservant/Slave (*douloi*): One who is in <u>service</u> to another, whether <u>forcibly</u> or <u>voluntarily</u> oModern equivalent: <u>Employees</u>
- Called to <u>obey</u> our employers as we do Christ oShowing them <u>respect</u> as those whom God has placed in <u>authority</u> over us oServing with a <u>sincere</u> heart
 - This means:
 - Not doing the bare minimum
 - Not working hard only when they notice
- This is a matter of perspective
 - oWe must see our work as a ministry
 - oWe are serving Jesus, even as we are serving others (v. 8)
 - Our work should be done for the glory of God
 - We should look to Him to <u>reward</u> our labor

Masters/Bosses (6:5-9)

- Master: One who has others in his <u>service</u>, whether <u>forcibly</u> or <u>voluntarily</u> oModern equivalent: <u>Employers/bosses</u>
- Called to treat their employees like <u>fellow</u> servants of the <u>Lord</u> oNot being <u>harsh</u> oShowing no <u>favoritism</u>

So What?

- Do we see our work as a ministry to both God and others?
- Are we serving others in love, regardless of our role?
