The Gospel of John: For God So Loved

John 3:13-21

The Son of Man (v. 13-15)

• Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that He has the authority to speak of heavenly truth because He is the <u>Son</u> of <u>Man</u> (Dan 7:13-14)

oWhose ultimate mission is to be king of the whole world

- He uses the imagery from the Israelites' experience in the wilderness to describe His mission (Num 21:4-9)
 - OLike the bronze snake, Jesus must be lifted up
 - And all who look on Him will be healed of their rebellious hearts & be given eternal life
 - "Lifted up" = His <u>crucifixion</u>
 - The bronze snake <u>foreshadowed</u> the work of Jesus

The Love of God (v. 16-18)

- The driving force behind Jesus' mission is the love of God
- He loves the whole world *so* much that He sent His Son to <u>suffer</u> and <u>die</u> for us oOur rebellious hearts have earned us <u>death</u>
 - o'The love of God at work in Jesus' sacrifice gives us eternal life
 - We access this eternal life through <u>belief/faith</u> in Him
- Jesus did not come to <u>condemn</u> the world, He came to <u>save</u> it oBut if we reject <u>Jesus</u>, we reject the <u>salvation</u> He offers oThen, we are left in our <u>condemned</u> state

Light Has Come (v. 19-21)

- Jesus comes as <u>light</u> to shine in the <u>darkness</u> of our sinful world (1:5)
- But we often prefer darkness because we think it <u>hides</u> our <u>sins</u> oThis is <u>self-delusion</u> because we cannot <u>hide</u> our sins from God (Heb 4:13; Lk 12:3)
- But when we accept Jesus, He reveals our <u>sins</u> to <u>cleanse</u> us of them • The closer we walk with Him, the <u>dirtier</u> we realize we are, and the more He <u>cleanses</u> us • This ongoing process is called <u>sanctification</u> (1 John 1:7)
- As He works in us through His Holy Spirit, we don't have to hide anymore because: • We are <u>loved</u>

oWe are <u>accepted</u>

oWhat good we do, we do through His strength, not ours

So What?

- Have we experienced the love of God given through Jesus?
- Or are we still trying to hide our sins rather than letting Jesus deal with them?
