The God who Reveals

- God reveals Himself to humanity in 2 major ways:
 - o General/Natural revelation (Rom. 1:20)
 - God revealed in the natural world
 - Examples:
 - oThe grandeur and beauty of nature (Ps. 19:1-6)
 - oThe human conscience (Rom. 2:14-15)
 - OOthers?

OSpecial revelation

- The <u>Bible</u> (1 Pet. 1:10-12)
- <u>JESUS</u> (Luke 10:22; 2 Cor. 4:4; Col 1:15)
 - In the incarnation, life, and teaching of Christ God is revealed most fully

What is the Bible?

- The account of God's <u>action</u> in the world, and His <u>purpose</u> with all creation. oGod is the primary focus of every part of the Bible
- Written over <u>16</u> centuries (c. 1400 BC- AD 90) • By over <u>40</u> human authors
- Divided into 2 <u>Testaments</u>*
 - oThe Old Testament (Genesis-Malachi)
 - OT for short
 - oThe New Testament (Matthew-Revelation)
 - NT for short
 - oTestament means covenant
- Collection of 66 books by western counting
 - oWestern counting: 39 OT + 27 NT
 - oHebrew counting: 24 OT
 - Samuel, Kings, Chronicles each 1 book
 - Ezra/Nehemiah 1 book
 - Hosea-Malachi = 1 book = Book of the 12
- Variety of Literary Styles = <u>Genres</u>
 - oLetters, Narratives, Gospels, Parables, Law, History, Prophecy, Wisdom Literature, Proverbs, Songs, Poetry
- Marked by both diversity and unity
