The Big Picture: A Covenant for All Creation (Gen. 6 & 9)

The Flood (Gen. 6:11-13)

- Human <u>sin/wickedness</u> was so great that God would bring <u>judgment</u> on the earth because of it oNot just humanity would suffer, <u>creation</u> would too
 - Because of humanity's tie to it as its <u>caretakers</u>
- Noah is singled out as a <u>righteous</u> man (Gen. 6:9) • Implies a <u>relationship</u>
- God's concern is with all of Creation

oThus, He looks to not only start fresh with Noah, but with the animals who would otherwise not <u>survive</u> the Flood as well

- How will God deal with our sin?
 - oThrough Judgment?
 - 0Through <u>Mercy</u>?

0<u>BOTH</u>!

A Renewed Covenant (Gen. 9:1-17)

- Noah acts as a <u>type</u> of Adam
 - oTypology: A literary hermeneutical device in which an earlier revealed person, event, or institution is understood to correspond with a later revealed person, event, or institution in a way that brings understanding to the latter

0Noah has a <u>relationship</u> with God

- Will become the <u>father</u> of all surviving humanity
- Just like Adam, Noah & family are:
- oReminded to be fruitful & multiply
 - Filling the <u>earth</u>*
- oReminded that God has given them plants to eat
 - And now <u>animals</u> too, but without <u>blood</u>
- oReminded of the image-bearing status of humanity
 - Thus, the prohibition against <u>murdering</u> another human
- God reestablishes the covenant He made with Adam with Noah and his offspring oClarifying that sin will be dealt with, but through a flood
 - Covenantal Sign: <u>Rainbow</u>

So What?

- We were not created for toil and pain • We *were* created with a job to do
- Are we trusting God to deal with our sin?
