What Defines Us

- What defines us as the Church is our shared beliefs in who God is and who we are as a result
- Throughout history Christians have expressed the core of their shared beliefs in <u>Statements</u> of Faith or Creeds
 - oWe are going to spend the summer looking at our Statement of Faith
- We stick to these <u>essentials</u> because they are centered on the truth of God and His Word o And bring <u>unity</u> among His people
 - oWe can have differing opinions about everything else
- True biblical belief is NOT simply mental affirmation oIt supposed to shape our thinking, decisions, and actions

EFCA Statement of Faith, Article 1, pt. 1

We believe in one God, Creator of all things, holy, infinitely perfect, ...

One God

- The Bible is clear that there is only <u>one true God</u>
 OJesus calls this the <u>greatest commandment</u> (Mark 12:29-30, cf. Deut. 6:4-5)
- This is not simply an issue of being monotheistic
 - OBut also speaks of the <u>place</u> that God is to have in the life of those who trust in Him (Ex. 20:2-6)
 - There are other <u>supernatural</u> beings, but they are not GOD
 - And there are other <u>created</u> things that vie for our devotion, but they should not take His place in our lives

Creator of All

- The name that God gives Himself is YHWH: <u>I AM THAT I AM</u> (Ex. 3:14)
 - Often translated in the OT as The LORD
 - The essence of existence
- All things exist because YHWH <u>created</u> them
 - OHe is the only <u>uncreated</u> thing (John 1:3)
 - oThus, other supernatural beings are NOT GOD because YHWH is their <u>source</u> (Ps. 33:6; Col. 1:16-17)
- God created ex nihilo (out of nothing) (Heb. 11:3; Gen. 1:1-2)
 - oGenesis 1 & 2 give accounts of His creative efforts in what we see, but this is hardly the whole of the story

The Holy & Perfect One

• Because God is the creator of all things, He is distinct from His creation o'This is the essence of <u>holiness</u>

- Holy: <u>Set apart</u> (Ex. 15:11)
- God is not <u>bound</u> in any way by that which He has created, and yet does not <u>separate</u> Himself from His creation (Isa. 57:15)
- God is without weakness, fault, or corruption (Deut. 32:4; Ps. 18:30)

So What?

- We can trust the LORD in everything because He is the one and only true God who is above all and before all and because He is perfect and holy.
- Are we trusting Him alone?
