James 3:13-18

The Litmus Test (v. 13)

- The churches that James wrote to likely were dealing with <u>divisiveness</u>
 - oMuch of his language around wisdom in this section speaks to determining who speaks with the authority rooted in Holy Spirit-given wisdom
- James offers a simple test for those who claim to be wise & learned
 - OWise: Applying the truth in appropriate ways
 - oLearned: An expert in a field
 - These are qualifications given in the OT for Israel's leadership (Deut 1:13; 4:6)
 - Also used to describe the prophet Daniel (Dan 5:11)
- The test: Do they practice what they preach?
 - oGood works
 - 0 Humility
- However, a simple test is not enough if you don't understand the results o'Thankfully, James gives us a way to interpret the results

Worldly Wisdom (v. 14-16)

- The antithesis of <u>humility</u> is:
 - OBitter envy: a <u>self-oriented</u> desire to possess things that are not ours (see Acts 5:17; 13:45; Rom. 13:13; 1 Cor. 3:3; 2 Cor. 12:20; Gal. 5:20)
 - OSelfish ambition (eritheia):
 - Related to strife (eris; cf. Rom 1:29; 13:13; 1 Cor 1:11; 3:3; 2 Cor 12:20; Gal 5:20; Phil 1:15; 1 Tim 6:4; Tts 3:9)
- This false "wisdom" is characterized as
 - oEarthly: Based on human reason, not divine revelation (the world)
 - oUnspiritual: Based on a worldview that excludes God (the flesh)
 - oDemonic: Based on lies from our spiritual enemy (the devil)

The Marks of Real Wisdom (v. 17-18)

- Those with godly wisdom are:
 - oPure: innocence & moral blamelessness
 - OPeace-loving: seeking unity
 - OConsiderate: yielding to the needs of others
 - OSubmissive: yielding to the ideas of others, when it is in non-essential areas
 - oMerciful: love for one's neighbor that shows itself in action (2:8-13)
 - o Fruitful in good deeds (2:14-26)
 - oImpartial: not showing favoritism (2:1-4)
 - OSincere (lit. "not playing a part): Transparency
- This test is summarized in v. 18
 - oThose who are truly wise make <u>peace</u>, not division, and show their wisdom through their <u>righteous</u> behavior
 - o"Like true faith (2:14-26), true wisdom is identified by the quality of life that it produces." Douglas J. Moo

So What?

- Are we putting the sources we consume as wisdom to the test?
- Would we pass this test?

 oIf not, then we need to seek God to make us wise (Jas 1:5)
