## Ephesians: Who Do You Think You Are?

(Eph. 1:1-14)

### Greetings (v. 1-2)

- Ephesians is a <u>letter</u> written by <u>Paul</u>
  - oWho identifies himself as an apostle chosen by God
    - Apostle: "Sent one"; a missionary with divine authority to establish & lead the Church
- Written to the church in Ephesus
  - oThe <u>3rd</u> largest city in the Roman Empire
  - oPaul had spent over <u>2</u> years building up the Church there around five years before this letter was written
  - oWhom Paul calls <u>holy</u> & <u>faithful</u>
- Greets them with a Greek (grace) & Jewish (peace) salutation

## Being "in Christ"

- Doesn't just mean we believe in Jesus
- It means that we are <u>positionally</u> in Him • God the Father sees <u>Jesus</u> when He looks at us
- We find our <u>identity</u> in that relationship • And we receive the <u>benefits</u> of that relationship
- This is a major theme in Ephesians oUsed <u>12</u> times from v. 1-14

# We Are... (v. 3-8a)

- <u>Blessed</u>: We have God's <u>hand</u> upon us oTo live <u>holy</u> & <u>blameless</u> lives
  - Holy: set apart for God's purpose
  - Blameless: used to refer to sacrifices being without blemish
    - Here it means morally clean
- Adopted/Chosen: Brought into God's family through Jesus
  - oPredestined: Never an individual focus
    - Always <u>communal</u>: God's <u>people/sons</u>
    - We are chosen because we are <u>in Christ</u>
      - Which brings privilege
      - But also, always brings responsibility
- <u>Forgiven</u>: Our sins have been paid for through Jesus' <u>blood</u> oRedeemed: Bought back from <u>slavery</u> to sin and death
- All through <u>grace</u>
  Not because of our <u>goodness</u>
  But, for His own good <u>purpose</u>

## We Are... (v. 8b-14)

Part of God's <u>eternal plan</u>
 Which He has made known & is accomplishing through <u>Jesus</u>
 Which He continues to work out through <u>us</u>

- Recipients of His <u>Spirit</u> • Given to us as a <u>guarantee</u> of our <u>inheritance</u> as adopted heirs • Who makes His <u>grace</u> work in and through us
  - The Spirit's work in us shows that we truly <u>belong</u> to God

### So What?

- Are we in Christ?
  - oDo we find our identity in Him?
- Do we see ourselves as blessed, chosen, forgiven children who have a part to play in God's plan and work in the world through His Spirit at work in us?
