A New Year, A New Outlook

(2 Corinthians 5:14-20)

A New Year

- The New Year marks a time of reflection
 - OAsking what motivates us
 - ORenewing our outlook
 - OBeing reminded of our mission

Love as Our Motivator (v. 14-15)

- The Love that Jesus showed us should "compel" us
 - \circ Συνέχω (sunecho): to hold together, constrain, squeeze in on all sides (like cattle)
 - oForces us forward
- His love is shown in His death on our behalf
 - oHe died *for* us, not *instead* of us
 - Therefore, we are dead to our old selves
 - We ought to live this new life

A New Outlook (v. 16-17)

- If we are sharing in Christ's death, then we share in His <u>resurrection</u> life
 - OWhich means we are to be living Jesus' life
 - Having His outlook
- Starting with how we see <u>Jesus</u>, Himself
- Then how we see ourselves
 - oWe are new creations in Christ
 - oWe need to stop living like we are our old selves
 - oWe need to stop believing the lies
- Then how we see others
 - They are not the enemy
 - oThey are <u>prisoners</u> in need of rescuing

Our Mission (v. 18-20)

- Ambassadors
 - oThose who act on behalf of and with the authority of the King
 - oWe bring to others the message of the King
 - With the authority of His name (see John 1:14)
- The Message: "Come Home!"
 - OReconciliation: Restoring and reestablishing broken relationships
 - oGod doesn't hold our sins against us
 - OHe wants to restore a relationship with us

So What?

- We need to see ourselves and each other the way Jesus does • As New Creations
- We need to share this message with others
- Seeing the task not as a battle but as a rescue mission
