Lies We Believe: Christians shouldn't judge?

Matt. 7:1-6; Various Texts

The Claim: "Christians shouldn't judge"

- The underlying premise: We are not supposed call the behavior of others sinful
- Based off Jesus' words in Matt. 7:1a, "Do not judge." • Used often by non-Christians towards Christians

Scripture's Truth

• This is an example of the importance of context

 \circ We must read the whole statement of what Jesus is saying to understand what He means \circ And then we must apply that meaning correctly

Judging the Context (Matt. 7:1-6)

- Part of the <u>Sermon</u> on the <u>Mount</u> • Teaching the crowds of people
- What does 'judge' mean here?
 To pass judgment or condemn someone's behavior as wrong/sinful
- Jesus tells us not to judge others, unless we are ready for that judgment to be turned back on us
- He is pointing out the <u>intent</u> of judgment by the individual
 If the intent is <u>condemnation</u>, then we are out of line (Luke 6:37; Rom. 2:1)
 However, if the intent is <u>correction</u>
 - Then we better be sure that we are not suffering the <u>same sin</u> as the one who are seeking to correct
 - "Plank/speck" image
- He does NOT say don't help your brother correct their sin

Pearls & Swine

- We must also assess the ability of the 'be-speckled' brother to <u>receive</u> our words of correction (Pro 26:4-5)
- It is the <u>wisdom</u> of godly correction Jesus calls <u>scared</u> & a <u>pearl</u> (Matt. 7:6)

The Error of Misapplication

- We often take a morsel of a truth and misapply it
- "Don't pass judgement for the purpose of condemnation" becomes
 - $\circ \text{``Don't}$ have any level of discernment between what is right and wrong."
 - $\circ \text{``Don't}$ lovingly correct someone caught in sin."

The Full Counsel of Scripture

- The solution to this error is to look at the full counsel of Scripture
- We are never called to <u>pass judgment</u> or <u>condemn</u> someone else, because that is <u>God's</u> job (Rom 14:10)
- But rather, to have <u>discernment</u> between good and evil (Heb 5:14) • The Church is to have such <u>discernment</u> that we will judge <u>angels</u> (1 Cor. 6:3)
- God tells us to judge using <u>His</u> standards, not <u>human</u> ones (John 7:24)
- And to apply these standards to those within the <u>Church</u>, not those outside (1 Cor. 5:12)
- Which is for the purpose of <u>correction</u> and <u>restoration</u> (Gal. 6:1)

So What?

- We are not called to pass judgment on others But rather to lovingly correct and restore them
- This is limited to those who call Christ Lord
 OWe cannot expect the world to live like they know Jesus
- Are we practicing discernment or passing judgment?
