ACTS: A Mixed Response

Acts 13:44-52

The Establishment's Response (v. 44-47)

- On the next Sabbath, people from all over the city came to the <u>synagogue</u> to hear Paul & Barnabus proclaim the Gospel
- The Jewish leadership's response was jealousy
 - They had never seen such a response from the city
 - OSO, they try to <u>argue</u> against Paul & Barnabus
- Paul & Barnabus answer with boldness
 - o Those Jews who refuse to believe were given opportunity
 - Thus, they had rejected <u>Jesus</u>, the source of <u>eternal life</u>
 - Now, eternal life is offered to the Gentiles
- This was the mission that God had given Paul & Barnabus
 - OHe quotes Isaiah 49:6 as proof
 - oIn fact, this is the mission of the whole <u>Church</u>: To call everyone to <u>repentance</u> and <u>faith</u> in <u>Jesus</u>

The Gentiles' Response (v. 48-49)

- The Gentiles are <u>elated</u> that God <u>included</u> them in His plan
 - And many <u>believed</u>
 - OAnd the Gospel spread like wildfire

Responses Intensify (v. 50-52)

- The Jewish leadership's jealousy grows
 - OThey rile up those in position of <u>power</u> to <u>persecute</u> Paul & Barnabus
- Paul & Barnabus follow <u>Jesus'</u> teaching about those who <u>reject</u> the Gospel (Matt. 10:14)
 - OA sign of dissociation with punishment that awaits those who reject the Lord
- Meanwhile, the Church grows in joy and is filled with the Holy Spirit
