Between Two Criminals

(Luke 23:32, 39-56)

Between Two Criminals (v. 32, 39-43)

- As Jesus was being crucified, He was not the only one being executed by the Romans
 A <u>criminal</u> was on each side of Him
- One of the criminals mocked Jesus
- The other <u>rebuked</u> him the mocker
 Seeing himself for who he was: <u>guilty</u>
 Seeing Jesus for who He is: <u>innocent</u>
- This criminal showed <u>faith</u> in Jesus that scarcely anyone else had (v. 42)
- His <u>faith</u> in Jesus secured him a place in <u>eternity</u>
 Even though he could do <u>nothing</u> for Jesus

The End? (v. 44-56)

- Those gathered were shaken by what they had seen as Jesus died
- And they lowered Jesus from the Cross and buried Him, thinking it was the end
- But there was one person who knew it wasn't the end
 The <u>criminal</u> who put His trust in Jesus

So What?

- We are all like one of the two criminals
 OWe either see ourselves for who we are, guilty in need of forgiveness
 Or we join the mockers
- We have nothing to offer Him
 And yet He loves and accepts us anyway when we put our faith in Him
