The Gospel of John: Another Advocate

John 14:15-31

The Paraclete (v. 15-21)

- <u>Obedience</u> to Jesus' teachings is the demonstration of our <u>love</u> for Jesus & the Father (v. 15, 21) oIt is how we continue His <u>mission</u> of making God known to the world
- But we are not alone in this mission because Jesus will ask His Father to send us a helper, the <u>Holy Spirit</u>
- Jesus repeatedly calls the Holy Spirit *paraclete* throughout this final teaching (14:15, 26; 15:26; 16:7) • *Paráklātos*: Lit. "one who comes <u>alongside</u>"
 - <u>Advocate/Intercessor</u>: One who appears on another's behalf
 - <u>Comforter</u>: One who provides support
 - <u>Helper</u>: One who helps us in our weakness
- The Holy Spirit's presence will be permanent
- He is the Spirit of <u>Truth</u> because:

oHe communicates the truth (14:26; 16:12-15)

oHe is the Spirt of Jesus, who is the Truth (14:6, 18; Acts 16:7)

- Thus, Jesus's claim that He will not <u>orphan</u> us but will <u>come</u> to us (v. 18)
- Jesus is present with His disciples through the Holy Spirit
- The Spirit is unknown to the world because they are lost in <u>darkness</u> & <u>lies</u> But those who know Jesus will recognize the Spirit just like those who know the
 - oBut those who know Jesus will <u>recognize</u> the Spirit just like those who know the Father <u>recognize</u> Jesus
 - This reflects the <u>Tri-unity</u> (<u>Trinity</u>) of the <u>Godhead</u>
 - Jesus invites us into the intimacy God shares in Himself (v. 20)

Obedience & Peace (v. 22-27)

- The question arises: *How* can Jesus reveal Himself to just the disciples and not the world? • The expectation for the <u>Messianic</u> reign is that it will be <u>evident</u> to the whole world • However, Jesus' kingdom is demonstrated through His disciples' <u>obedience</u> to His teaching through God's <u>indwelling presence</u> in the person & work of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>
- While Jesus walked the earth, He <u>taught</u> the truth of God oNow that He is going away, the Spirit will <u>teach</u> this same truth
- Jesus promises His <u>peace</u>, which is administered through the presence of the <u>Spirit</u> (Gal 5:22) oA <u>serenity</u> in our spirits based on our restored relationship with <u>God</u> & <u>one another</u> (Rom 5:1; Eph 4:3; Col 3:15)

oThis means we can have peace even amid the <u>turmoil</u> of this world (14:27; 16:33)

Going & Coming (v. 28-31)

• Jesus will continue teaching, but for His mission to succeed, the time has come to leave. This refers both to:

oLeaving the <u>upper room</u> where they are having the Passover meal (v. 31b) oJesus' imminent <u>death</u>, <u>resurrection</u>, & <u>return</u> to the Father

• Jesus' statement "the Father is greater than I" is NOT a claim of a hierarchy of divinity or value within the Godhead

- oRather, in context, Jesus is claiming that His disciples should rejoice that Jesus is returning to the realm of the Father, where He was before His <u>incarnation</u>, because He is then able to be <u>ever-present</u> through the <u>Spirit</u>
- Jesus then tells His disciples that the enemy is about to launch his attack o'The Prince of this World: <u>Satan</u>
- And despite the initial appearance of the enemy's triumph, he has no true power over Jesus, the source of <u>life</u>

oSatan plots to have Jesus killed, yet it is through His death that He secures victory & salvation

So What?

- To continue His mission, Jesus promises the Holy Spirit to all who trust in Him. Have you put your trust in Jesus?
- The Holy Spirit empowers us to live in obedience to God. We cannot be godly without Him. Are we relying on the Spirit?
