James: The Internal War

James 4:1-3

The Conflict Within (v. 1-2a)

- Using leading questions, James points out that the source of conflict in our relationships is not external
 - The problem is not other people
- The conflict is internal
 - Our desires are at war within us
- Desires (hēdonēs): Thoughts that center on pleasure or enjoyment
 - oThese unmet desires lead us to covet
 - Covet: To desire what you do not have (Ex 20:17)
- This attitude produces <u>sinful</u> actions
 - OVerbal arguments
 - oPhysical altercations
 - 0 Murder

Why We Lack (v. 2b-3)

- We have this internal war due to a lack within us
 - OWhat we think we lack:

OWhat we actually lack:

- Security
- Acceptance
- Love

- <u>Money</u> & <u>Power</u>
- <u>Esteem</u>
- <u>Pleasure</u>
- We wrongly believe that these needs will be met by others • When what we really need comes from <u>God</u>, who freely gives to us when we <u>ask</u>
- But God will not give us things to satiate our sinful desires
 - ORather, if we truly seek Him, He transforms our desires
 - Where there was lust, He brings <u>selflessness</u>
 - Where there was pride, He brings <u>humility</u>
 - Where there was covetousness, He brings contentment
